#### Just these thoughts my friends...

As the Gospel of John unfolds with the story of the first Easter morning, we become immediately aware of the fact that there is a lot of running taking place. And this means that you and I can relate. Mary Magdalene, in her grief and exhaustion from the agony of the previous days has, in an act of compassion, made her way to the tomb. She has gone there to lovingly care for the body of her dear friend. But after finding the tomb empty, she is hit with a rush of adrenaline, and runs to tell Peter and the beloved disciple the astonishing news. Peter will put on his running sandals and run back to the tomb to see with his own eyes what Mary has reported. John tells us that Peter will be outrun by his friend. For everything that Peter was, he apparently wasn't the fastest runner. I know the feeling. But the account seems clear. Mary is running to "tell" the story of the empty tomb. Peter and John are running to "see" the empty tomb. All of them are running to Easter, still not totally sure of what all of this may mean. And it is there, on that first Easter, that Mary, exhausted from all of her running and numb from sadness, encountered the risen Savior. And it is there, at the empty tomb, that she heard Jesus call her by name: "Mary!"

It seems that one of our greatest desires in this life is to be known; to be thought well of, to be respected and honored, to be liked and maybe even loved. It is the rare person in this life who just doesn't care about what anyone thinks of them. But most of us, if we are honest, probably aren't that person. We care about what people think about us. We care about being known. We want to be accepted. We want to be loved. So we strive, and we strive, and we strive, and we run, and we run, and we run. Only to fall exhausted at the end of most days, still lacking from the world around us that which we so earnestly long for.

Rock friends, Easter is a reminder that our risen savior calls us by name. The risen savior calls us by name, and loves us into a life that is devoted, not to this world, but to running the race he has set before us, with our eyes ever on him. Can you hear him calling your name?



#### A Word From the Piano Bench by Sandra Hix

#### Hymn "Morning Has Broken"

**"Morning Has Broken**" is a Christian hymn first published in 1931. It has words by English author Eleanor Farjeon and is set to a traditional Scottish Gaelic tune, "Bunessan". English pop musician and folk singer Cat Stevens included a version



on his album, *Teaser and the Firecat*, in 1971. The song became identified with Stevens due to the popularity of this recording. It reached number six on the U.S. Billboard Hot 100 and number one on the US easy listening chart in 1972. But the origin of the song came about when there was a need for a hymn to give thanks for each day. Eleanor Farjeon, who was an English poet and children's author, had been "asked to make a poem to fit the lovely Scottish tune." The song is often associated with children's music and the arrival of spring. The hymn is in our current hymnal on page 45.
