

Contemporary Christian Artist Michael W. Smith

Michael W. Smith was born in 1957 in West Virginia to dedicated parents who took him to church regularly. As a child, he developed his love of music while attending his church. He learned to play piano at an early age and sang in church choirs. At the age of 10 he became a Christian. Influenced by older friends who shared his faith, he started studying the Bible and spent time in fellowship with other Christians. In 1978 he moved to Nashville where he started his involvement in the music scene. In 1981 he joined his first Christian Band, Higher Ground, as their keyboard player. Soon after he became a writer for Meadowgreen Music, writing lyrics for artists such as Sandi Patty, Kathy Tricoli, Bill Gaither, and Amy Grant. His connection with Amy Grant led to him joining her band and becoming the opening act for her concerts. In 1983 he released his first album, "The Michael W. Smith" Project, which contained his first big hit "Friends". After that he has gone on to record many hit albums in the Christian music genre, Christmas genre, and Instrumental genre. We have seven hymns in our hymnal written by Michael. Two of the most popular are: "How Majestic Is Your Name" and "Shine on Us". Our Christmas cantata this year will also feature one of his songs: "Christmastime."
