A Recap of our Costa Rica Mission Trip Experience:

Our journey began early Monday morning, meeting at the church and departing for GSP Airport at 3 AM. After checking in and making it to our gate, we were playfully scolded by the gate agent for cutting it a little close—but from there, our flights to Miami and then to San José went smoothly.

When we landed, we were greeted by Ludem and our Costa Rican friends with warm smiles, hugs, and pure joy—the kind of welcome that instantly fills your heart. It made us think... if this is how it feels to be welcomed here on earth, imagine the celebration that awaits us when we're greeted in heaven by our Savior—arms open wide, love overflowing, and joy beyond measure.

Our mission wasn't just about moving dirt or painting posts—it was about serving with purpose, loving others well, and being the hands and feet of Jesus.

We came to partner with our brothers and sisters in Christ and witnessed how God is doing mighty things in Costa Rica. Testimony after testimony revealed His power at work—restoring broken families, calling believers to serve others, and welcoming prodigal sons and daughters back home to Him.

Our only hiccup came on the way home, when our flight from San José was delayed, causing us to miss our connection in Miami. We spent the night there before finally making it back to Greenwood the next day. Even then, we could see God's hand at work—His protection and timing guiding every step.

We returned home with grateful hearts, renewed faith, and a deeper bond with our Rock Presbyterian family.



"Come, Ye Thankful People, Come" by Henry Alford

As a junior high school student, I will always remember preparing for our Thanksgiving Chorus Concert. Our teacher, Mrs. Collins, would bring out some of the same songs each year. These arrangements were mostly intended for girls with soprano and alto parts, boys were not usually in the chorus or ensemble (an auditioned group) during the 1970's. Each year "Come, Ye Thankful People, Come" would be sung. I always wondered what "tares" was when we got to the second verse in the line "Wheat and tares together sown". Matthew 13:24-30 tells us "The Parable of the Weeds" where the man sowed good wheat seed in his field, but at night an enemy came and sowed weeds or "tares" among the good seed. The good seed and the weeds grew up together in the field. When it came time for harvest, the workers gathered the weeds first and destroyed them, then returned to gather the good wheat. The second verse of the song begins "We ourselves are God's own field, Fruit unto His praise to yield". In our lives we can strive to bear "wheat" for God with our good deeds, but sometimes our thoughts and actions will produce "weeds". This Thanksgiving season let us be thankful that we have a Savior who can forgive our "tares" and as in the last line of verse two, "Whole-some grain and pure may be".


